Eligibility Criteria

- Admission to the Post Graduate Program in Crafting Creative Communications (CCC Advanced) require a Bachelor's degree (10 + 2 + 3 system) or an equivalent qualification in any discipline recognized by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
- o Bachelor's degree with at least 50% marks or equivalent CGPA in any discipline from a recognised university.
- Candidates appearing for the final year bachelor's degree/equivalent qualification examination and those who have completed the degree requirements and are awaiting results can also apply. It is mandatory for such candidates must do the following:
 - Produce a certificate from the principal/director/registrar/head of the department of the institution/university certifying that the candidate is currently in the final year/is awaiting final results, stating that they have completed all the requirements (the result may, however, be awaited) for obtaining the bachelor's degree/equivalent qualification on the date of issue of the certificate. This certificate should be submitted latest by June 30, 2026,
 - Such a candidate, if selected, and submits the above-mentioned certificate will be allowed to join the programme provisionally. The admission will be confirmed only when the candidate submits the final mark sheet and certificate of having passed the bachelor's degree/equivalent qualification.

The deadline for submission of the final mark sheet and passing certificate is December 31, 2026. Non-fulfillment of this condition will automatically result in the cancellation of the provisional admission.

Candidates who demonstrate an aptitude for expressing, assessing, and /or conceiving ideas that move people to action and achieve business results tend to stand a better chance of being shortlisted.

Who should apply?

We will be applying for the AICTE approval.

Applicants are not required to take the CAT (Common Admission Test) for this programme. However, they must appear for the MICAT, which is a Computer-Based Test (CBT) conducted twice a year—in December 2025 and February 2026. Candidates may choose to take both MICAT I and MICAT II, and the better of the two scores will be considered for evaluation. The test is held at over 48 centres across India.

Additionally, a **Bachelor's degree or an equivalent qualification** in any discipline, recognized by the **Association of Indian Universities**, is a mandatory requirement.

We are looking for aspirants who are essentially creative, intellectually curious, vividly imaginative with a diverse set of interests. A flair for writing and the ability to visualize will be seen as an added advantage. The aspirant should be reasonably knowledgeable about the world of advertising, communication, art, visual design, digital media and entertainment while possessing lateral thinking capabilities with an inherent passion for learning.
